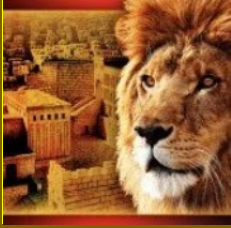

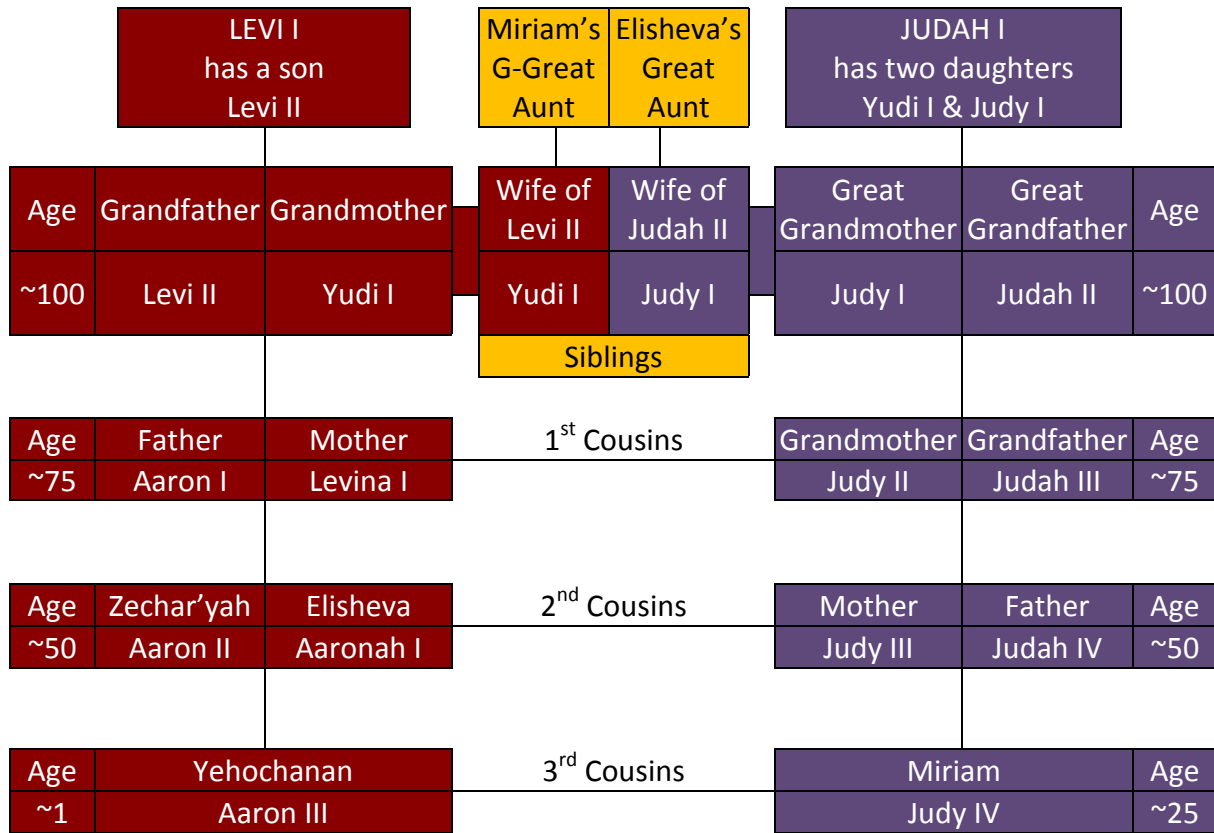


## Time Line 16

# Time Line 16

Showing how Judah Line and Levitical Lines could be Lawfully Mixed



The sons of Aaron can only marry Levite women; **V'yikra (Leviticus) 21:7-14**, but Levites who are not sons of Aaron can marry virgins from any tribe that they themselves live in. So for Elisheva (a daughter of Aaron) and Miriam (a daughter of Judah) to be blood related, they had to have Great Aunts who were siblings.

In Elisheva's case, Elisheva's grandfather is a Levite (Levi II) who marries a virgin of Judah (Yudi I). They have a daughter (Levina I). Elisheva's father of Aaronic descent (Aaron I) then marries the daughter (Levina I). Elisheva is now a daughter of Aaronic lineage, even though her grandmother was of the lineage of Judah.

In Miriam's case, the lineage is much simpler, a woman can marry into any tribe, and is only forbidden to marry into another tribe if she has no brothers to receive their father's inheritance; **B'midbar (Numbers) 36:1-12**. So Judy I, II & III just chose to marry within the tribe, whereas Yudi I chose to marry a Levite who lived within the tribal boundaries of Judah.
